First, why didn't anyone from city council or staff reach out to the Sebastopol Downtown Association (SDA) with regard to the expansion of the Business Improvement Area (BIA) as outlined in agenda item number 13? This has been goal for the SDA for at least 10-years and both city council and staff is well aware of this fact.

Second, the idea that the "relaunch" city council subcommittee would ask Laura Hagar-Rush to re-design the Chamber website makes no sense when the SDA and its former president, have already invested hundreds of hours to develop an excellent and comprehensive business website that links to every BIA business's website, their Facebook page, and their Instagram page. If the city is going to invest in developing the Chamber website rather than expanding and refining the already "best in the city" SDA website, then the new Chamber website will include businesses outside of Sebastopol city limits. Therefore, this act will be a disincentive for businesses to agree to the expansion of the BIA because the BIA businesses will not agree to pay an assessment which in part, supports businesses outside our city's BIA.

Also, a BIA is just that, it is a "business" improvement district. City council should stay out of it unless a council member owns a business within the BIA and is an assessed member.
