CALDER CREEK NATURALIZATION PLAN CHOSEN

At the February 1 City
Council Meeting, the plan for
the Calder Creek
Naturalization project was
chosen between two options
brought forth by the Planning
Commission. The City
Council unanimously selected
Option B, which will retain
Polley Field and the other
major Master Plan elements,
while providing for a
naturalized, meandering
creek through Ives Park.



Option B: "Updated Charrette" – This concept is

based on an alignment and layout developed with the Ives Park Subcommittee/staff in an online charrette. The stream in this alternative has an appropriate level of channel length and sinuosity that makes it a dynamically stable channel. This means minimal "hard" engineering (retaining walls, guardrails, etc.) would be needed to maintain public safety. The meanders in the channel create opportunities for activity nooks such as picnic areas, enhances the art walk installations, and also helps to create a larger space for a great lawn event space. The is a low maintenance stream alignment that moves the creek away from the redwood trees.

Impact to Ives Park Master Plan:

The biggest change in Option B would be the elimination of the second gathering lawn east of the pool/south of the existing playground. It would instead retain the playground area in the general current location (with a possible expansion). The event space in the southwest portion of the park would need to be a slightly smaller event space created by the creek channel than in the Master Plan, but would curve further north toward the ball field; this option would potentially retain some of the redwood trees within the lawn/event space as well. This option has the potential to enhance the creek's health; create creek-side spaces and opportunities to interact with the creek; and, retain all the major components of the Master Plan.

SONOMA COUNTY LET RESTRICTIONS ON LARGE GATHERINGS EXPIRE ON FEBRUARY 10TH



With COVID-19 cases and hospitalizations declining, Sonoma County Health Officer Dr. Sundari Mase made clear on February 4th that a health order temporarily restricting the size of large gatherings will expire as scheduled at 11:59 p.m. on Feb. 10.

"The numbers are trending in the right direction, and there are clear signs that we are now past the peak of the winter surge in COVID-19 cases," said Dr. Sundari Mase, the county's health officer. "I am confident we will be able to safely lift our temporary restrictions on the size of gatherings starting Feb. 11."

However, Dr. Mase strongly encouraged residents, particularly seniors over the age of

65 with underlying health conditions and people who have not yet been boosted or vaccinated, to avoid large gatherings and continue wearing masks indoors around people outside their household, noting that the omicron surge is not yet over.

TWELVE BAY AREA HEALTH OFFICIALS TO LIFT MOST INDOOR MASK MANDATES ON FEBRUARY 16TH

Masks still strongly recommended; vaccines and boosters urged to further strengthen defenses

Santa Rosa, CA – February 9, 2022 – In alignment with the State, the Bay Area counties of Alameda, Contra Costa, Marin, Monterey, Napa, San Benito, San Francisco, San Mateo, Santa Cruz, Solano, Sonoma, and the City of Berkeley will lift universal mask requirements for most indoor public settings beginning Wednesday, February 16.

Unvaccinated individuals over age 2 will continue to be required to wear masks in all indoor public settings.
Businesses, venue operators and hosts

may determine their own paths forward to protect staff and patrons and may choose to require all patrons to wear masks.



The change aligns with the California Department of Public Health's decision to let expire the statewide indoor mask requirement, which was instated on December 15 during the latest COVID-19 surge. Indoor masking is still required by the state for everyone, regardless of vaccination status, in public transportation; health care settings; congregate settings like correctional facilities and homeless shelters; long-term care facilities; and in K-12 schools and childcare settings.

SONOMA COUNTY ANNOUNCES FOUR WEEKEND COVID-19 VACCINE CLINICS AT SONOMA COUNTY FAIRGROUNDS

The County of Sonoma will expand access to pediatric and adult COVID-19 vaccines and boosters through a series of large-scale vaccine clinics at the Sonoma County Fairgrounds starting Saturday.

Up to 500 vaccines can be administered per day at these clinics, which will be held in the Garrett Building on the Fairgrounds campus. Clinics will be held Saturday and Sunday for each of the next four weekends, Jan. 29-30 and Feb. 5-6, 12-13, and 19-20 from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.






