Good morning Dante,

If you could answer these four questions before tonight's Fire Department meeting, I am grateful.

- 1) If in the case of a local disaster whereby our well pumps and/or the main water lines leading to our city water storage tanks are knocked out of service for an indefinite time, how many days of water will we be able to supply to our residents without replenishing our storage tanks?
- 2) If in the case of a local disaster, is there a plan in place to protect and/or ration our water supply especially given the fact that Gold Ridge Fire District fills up all of their water tender firetrucks directly from our fire hydrants located in the Valley View neighborhood?
- 3) On average, how much of Sebastopol's water supply would you estimate that Gold Ridge Fire District uses per year?
- 4) Finally, in the case of a local disaster, is there a plan in place to protect, ration, and/or stop all other water suppliers who fill up their water trucks at the Public Works yard?
