Subject: Active Transportation Survey

Recommendation: The Climate Acton Committee recommends that Sebastopol issue a public Active Transportation survey that explores residents' views and understanding of Active Transportation (walking, scooter, and bicycling). The survey can be publicized and accessible through the City's electronic newsletter, weblink, in-person kiosk, and other appropriate means of communicating with Sebastopol citizens.

Background/Discussion:

Promoting Active Transportation [AT] and 'slow streets' to create vibrant, healthy communities can significantly reduce emissions and help Sebastopol reach its climate and safety goals. Transportation represents 66.7% of Sebastopol's GHG emissions inventory according to the RCPA 2018 GHG emission data in the Sebastopol Climate Action Committee Framework. The shift in behavior towards AT can decrease Vehicle Miles Traveled (VMT) and subsequently reduce traffic and the need for large parking areas. More bicycle and pedestrian traffic can help reduce traffic congestion near schools and possibly benefit the downtown economic area.

Goals:

We will measure and understand the current public use of Active Transportation and any barriers or underlying demand the city can unlock with changes to bicycle lanes, paths, sidewalks, or signage.

The Active Transportation survey will inform the Climate Action Committee's recommendations to reduce short-distance single-occupant vehicle travel (VMT). Survey results will guide targeted education efforts, program design, and transportation projects that will address transportation's large 60% share of city emissions.

The following Goals of the Sebastopol General Plan are potentially supported by getting the results of this survey:

Goal CIR 5: Reduce Vehicle Miles Traveled (VMT) in Order to Reduce Congestion and Help Achieve Regional Efforts to Reduce Greenhouse Gas (GHG) Emissions

The following Goals of the Sebastopol Climate Action Framework are potentially supported by getting the results of this survey: (I.e)

- T1. Prioritize active transportation in transportation planning to make Sebastopol people-centric, rather than car-centric.
- T2. Reduce vehicle miles traveled (VMT) by Sebastopol residents.

T3. Make biking, walking, and other active transportation options safer and easier by implementing a Complete Streets approach to street design.
