A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SEBASTOPOL APPROVING THE APPLICATION FOR THE LAND AND WATER CONSERVATION FUND FOR THE BURBANK EXPERIMENTAL FARM RESTROOM AND ACCESSIBILITY IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT

WHEREAS, the Congress under Public Law 88-578 has authorized the establishment of a federal Land and Water Conservation Fund Grant-In-Aid program, providing matching funds to the State of California and its political subdivisions for acquiring lands and developing Facilities for public outdoor recreation purposes; and

WHEREAS, the California Department of Parks and Recreation is responsible for administration of the program in the State, setting up necessary rules and procedures governing applications by local agencies under the program; and

WHEREAS, the applicant certifies by resolution the approval of the application and the availability of eligible matching funds prior to submission of the application to the State; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Sebastopol hereby:

- 1. Approves the filing of an application for Land and Water Conservation Fund assistance for the proposed Burbank Experimental Farm Restroom Facility and ADA Path Project
- 2. Certifies that the applicant has reviewed, understands, and agrees to the General Provisions contained in the contract shown in the Grant Administration Guide; and
- 3. Agrees to abide by 54 U.S.C. §200305(f)(3) which requires, "No property acquired or developed with assistance under this section shall, without the approval of the National Secretary of the Interior, be converted to other than public outdoor recreation uses. The Secretary shall approve such conversion only if he finds it to be in accord with the then existing comprehensive statewide outdoor recreation plan and only upon such conditions as he deems necessary to assure the substitution of other recreation properties of at least equal fair market value and of reasonably equivalent usefulness and location."
- 4. Certifies that said agency has matching funds from eligible source(s) and can finance 100 percent of the project, which up to half may be reimbursed; and
- 5. Agrees to comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws, ordinances, rules, regulations and guidelines.
- 6. Appoints the Assistant City Manager as agent of the applicant to conduct all negotiations and execute and submit all documents, including, but not limited to, applications, contracts, amendments, payment requests, and compliance with all applicable current state and federal laws which may be necessary for the completion of the aforementioned project.

The goal of the Luther Burbank Experimental Farm project is to make comprehensive improvements to the Park to insure access to the Park by individuals with physical disabilities. This improvements include the construction of an ADA compliant public restroom facility, an ADA compliant parking stall and a concrete walkway from the parking stall to the restroom facility. This will necessitate the installation of new sewer, water and electrical service. As a result of this project individuals with disabilities will be able to visit the Farm and enjoy the unique experience of viewing first hand, the botanical wonders created by the famed Luther Burbank.
