### NOTICE TO RESIDENTS

In the Vicinity of: Parquet Street and Calder Avenue WATER AND SEWER FACILITIES CONSTRUCTION

Piazza Construction began replacement of existing water and sewer facilities along Parquet Street and Calder Avenue (approximately 7438 to 7464). The project is necessary to ensure the integrity and reliability of the City of Sebastopol's water and sewer system. Work started on August 14th, 2023 and will be completed by approximately December 2023. Work hours are from 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday.

During construction, please be aware of heavy equipment and construction personnel and follow instruction of the contractor's flaggers and signs. Residents will always have access to their homes, but it



may take a few minutes to clear a safe path. Please be patient. Please reduce your travel speed to maintain safe conditions within the construction zone. Noise levels will be increased during construction.

We appreciate your cooperation and patience during the construction. We will make our best effort to minimize the inconvenience as much as possible for the duration of the project. ## ADVANCED METERING INFRASTRUCTURE (AMI) OPT-OUT PROGRAM INFORMATION

At the City of Sebastopol, we support offering our customers a choice in metering infrastructure. The AMI Opt-Out Program is for residential customers who prefer not to have the data collector/ transmitter installed with their water meter. The program allows customers to have their meter read manually at the end of every month at no additional cost to the customer.



Most customers look forward to having an automated meter installed at their home and taking advantage of the many benefits that this technology offers, such as fewer visits from field service representatives and immediate access to consumption information. ## SEBASTOPOL CARBON CONVERSATIONS - BIKES AS TRANSPORT - SEPTEMBER 6



### **Bikes as Transport**

Transportation is the leading source of greenhouse gasses (CO2) in Sonoma County [per the Regional Climate Protection Authority]. Bicycling is one option for getting around town while curbing emissions due to fossil-fuel-dependent transportation. We'll hear from folks that routinely ride their bikes to get to work, school, or run errands around town. Some with electric boost and some not. We'll also share about existing resources available to cyclists here in Sebastopol.

According to **Project Drawdown, Bicycle Infrastructure** is essential for supporting safe and abundant bicycle use, and achieving significant emission reductions (with additional benefits: improved health, lower congestion, reduced air pollution, reduced fuel consumption, etc.)

The City of Sebastopol, along with County of Sonoma, has just initiated the process of updating the **Active Transportation Plan** (formerly called the Bike and Pedestrian Master Plan). We'll learn more about this process and explore a vision of what a Bike-friendly Sebastopol could look like.
