**INTRODUCTION/PURPOSE:** This item is to request that City Council Discuss the Recommendations from the Mayor for City Council and City Staff Committee Assignments with City Council Ratification/Approval of Recommendations. This agenda item could also include amendment, deletion or creation of committees upon Council consideration and approval.

### BACKGROUND:

Currently, each year, the City Council makes appointments to the various committees. Committees include:

1) City membership in a separate agency where the representative is a member of the governing board;

2) the City representative is a member of an advisory committee that makes recommendations to another public agency;

3) a Council member or Staff member is appointed as a liaison to a special committee;

4) other miscellaneous committees; and

5) Council created Ad Hoc or Standing Committees or Subcommittees

Prior to December 2022, the Council as a whole reviewed and discussed the Committee Assignments for the upcoming Calendar Year. The Council was provided a list of Committees and the City Council reviewed each committee asking for volunteers or those interested to serve on the committee(s). Once everyone had submitted their names, Councilmembers interested would provide comments and advocate for their appointment to a committee; and then the Council would discuss the appointment to the committee. After discussion the Council would recommend the Councilmember to the committee.

In December 2022, then Mayor Hinton proposed and the City Council approved a pilot program for a new process for City Council and City Staff Committee Assignments. It was felt that the new process would streamline the Committee Assignment process and allow individual Councilmembers to put forward their interests in which committees to the Mayor who will make recommendations to the full City Council.

### The process currently is as follows:

Upon Notification of Certification of the Election or by December 15th of each year, the Mayor will send to all Councilmembers and Councilmember Elects, a copy of the Current City Council and City Staff Committee Assignments as well as an application that a Councilmember would fill out and return to the Mayor for consideration. A separate application would be required for each Committee that a Councilmember is interested in. The Mayor would then review the applications submitted, speak with the Councilmember to obtain any additional information on their interest to serve on the committee, and provide a recommendation at the first meeting in January of each year of Council Committee Assignments. The Council would then be asked to approve/ratify the recommendations of the Mayor.

### DISCUSSION:

City staff distributed the applications to the City Councilmembers and all applications received were forwarded to the Mayor for consideration/recommendation. The applications are attached to this report for reference and information as Attachment B.

Mayor Rich has reviewed the applications, reviewed the committee assignments and is making recommendations as noted in Attachment A. If a staff member is required for specific outside agency committees, the City Manager has proposed Primary and, if needed, an alternate for that committee.

For Standing or Ad Hoc Council Committees, the City Manager will determine staff member support.
