A Message from New City Manager Don Schwartz

I would like to thank the City Council, Sebastopol residents and businesses, and the City staff for the warm welcome to this wonderful community. I am thrilled and honored to be your new City Manager. I bring a business mindset and a passion for public service.

Since starting on January 3 I've focused on listening and learning. From numerous conversations I've identified some top priorities:



- Addressing the City's overall financial situation, which is not good.

As I told the City Council when I was hired, I will always make recommendations to them based on the long-term best interests of the residents and businesses of Sebastopol. I pledge to work with the Council following my values of integrity, fiscal responsibility, and collaboration.

New Water Meters and App Offer Customers Enhanced Insights Into Their Water Usage



With the installation of new cellular water meters in Sebastopol, municipal water customers can now have instant access to, and greater control over, their water usage through the accompanying EyeOnWater app. They can also be alerted to leaks in real time. Signup options:

Safe Medication Disposal



Please don't flush unused medications down the toilet or throw them in the trash.

The City of Sebastopol is partnering with the Russian River Watershed Association (RRWA) to get the word out about the importance of safely disposing of unused

medications to help keep our waterways and wildlife healthy. Recent studies show that pharmaceuticals in rivers and streams, if present at high enough concentrations, can harm aquatic wildlife. When flushed down the drain, some medications are not completely removed by wastewater treatment plants and are discharged to surface waters.

Residents of Sonoma and Mendocino County can dispose of their unused, expired, or otherwise unwanted medications free of charge via free mail-in envelopes and at participating takeback locations including the Sebastopol Police Station.
