Finance Matters



Water and Sewer Rate Increases Being Considered

Water and sewer rates have not covered the costs of operating the City's systems for five years. One consequence is that our systems are in poor condition, which increases the risk of failures that would leave residents without water or sewer



service for what could be hours or even days at a time.

On April 23, the Council voted to bring rates to a level that will better cover the cost of operating and maintaining these systems. The increases would be substantial for many residents and businesses. The Council is continuing to consider options to balance the integrity of the system with the impact on residents and businesses.

At press time, the City Council was scheduled to consider adopting new rates at a public hearing scheduled for Tuesday, June 18, at 6:00 p.m. at the Youth Annex on Morris Street. As with all City Council meetings, you are welcome to attend in person or via Zoom.

Council Considers Proposed Sales Tax Measure for November 5, 2024 Ballot to Help Address Budget Shortfalls

As noted in recent City Council meetings, the City of Sebastopol faces major long-



term budget challenges with our General Fund, which supports most City functions including police, fire, land use, housing, maintenance of parks and facilities, support for non-profits, and administrative functions. Staff is preparing the budget for FY 24-25. We anticipate proposing significant budget cuts to achieve a balanced budget. In addition to significant budget cuts, a mix of strategies will be required to the address the budget challenges. These strategies include reducing expenses, increased revenue, economic development, and more.

Even with these additional strategies, we will continue to face financial challenges without a significant, ongoing source of additional revenue. One promising source of this revenue is an additional sales tax which would be paid by both residents and visitors. At its May 21st meeting the Council discussed placing either a quarter cent (additional projected revenue of \$760,000 annually) or half cent (additional projected revenue of \$1.5 million annually) sales tax increase on the November 5 ballot. The Council voted to conduct outreach and polling to determine if Sebastopol residents wish to pursue the ballot measure. Sebastopol Fire Department Consolidation with Gold Ridge Fire Protection District Moves Forward



After years of discussion and public input, at its April 16th meeting the Sebastopol City Council voted to pursue merging fire services with the Gold Ridge Fire Protection District.

Consolidation brings an additional \$1.1 million in annual funding through a parcel tax that currently runs at \$265/year for a typical single-family home, along with opportunities for economies of scale that would provide sufficient funding for quality fire services.

After extensive research and analysis, the Gold Ridge Fire District emerged as the best option for consolidation. It provides economies of scale, quality and depth of leadership, strategic thinking, governance advantages, and the benefits of experience in mergers.

Background: Despite the professionalism and dedication of our SFD team, response to calls for service is inadequate, either in the length of time to respond to calls, the number of qualified staff responding, or both. The key to improving response is to increase staff. Providing appropriate fire apparatus (trucks and engines) and a much-improved fire station are also essential. Even with Measure H adding \$1.1 million/year to fire services in Sebastopol, combining those funds with current City funding – which is at risk given the City's financial challenges – the level of funding is insufficient to provide an acceptable level of services. And Measure H could be overturned or at least subject to protracted litigation as the California Business Roundtable has placed a voter initiative on the November ballot that raises this possibility.
